The Most Wonderful Time of the Year

Though we are entering what is commonly called the most wonderful time of the year, it is also one of the busiest times of the year. Thus, it is also one of the most stressful times of the year. Students are gearing up for finals. Businesses are gearing up for year-end tasks. And people of all ages are gearing up for Christmas. There are decorations to put up, gifts to purchase, cards to address, cookies to bake, travels to plan, etc. In the hustle and bustle of the season, it's easy to lose sight of what is truly important. And I'm not talking about family and friends (as good as those precious gifts of God are).

Christmas — and the Advent season that precedes it — is a wonderful opportunity for each and every one of us to live in the world but not of the world, to set our minds on things above, to keep and ponder all the things concerning the Babe of Bethlehem in our hearts, and to proclaim the praises of Him who called us out of darkness into His marvelous light. How is this done? Below are twelve suggestions to help you keep Jesus at the center of your life this holy season:



- ✓ Attend Advent services. Each service offers a unique glimpse into God's heart as He sends His only-begotten Son into the world to save us from sin, death, and the power of the devil.
- ✓ Purchase an Advent wreath for your home, light the designated candles weekly, and hold family devotions around it every evening.
- ✓ Read the story of Saint Nicholas — a Christian pastor who lived in the fourth century and gave anonymous gifts to members of his community — on December 6.
- ✓ Give anonymous gifts. Teach your children and grandchildren the joy of giving gifts to someone in need. Consider our congregation's Giving Tree, local organizations like MorningStar Mission, etc.
- ✓ Set up a crèche in your home. Begin with an empty stable and some animals. Add Joseph and Mary shortly before Christmas. Add baby Jesus and the shepherds on Christmas Eve. Add the Wise Men on Epiphany.
- ✓ Pray the seven “O” antiphons the final week before Christmas (December 17-23). Each antiphon addresses Jesus using an Old Testament title for Him. These are found at the end of *LSB* 357.
- ✓ Attend as many Christmas services as you are able—the children's Christmas program, the Christmas Eve candlelight service of Lessons and Carols, and the Christmas Day festive Divine Service.
- ✓ Rather than simply buying more trinkets and stuff, give your loved ones at least one Christ-centered Christmas gift — an ornament, a decoration, a book, or a manger scene (or add new pieces each year), etc.
- ✓ Sing a Christ-centered Christmas hymn with family and friends before you eat your Christmas dinner or begin your Christmas festivities.
- ✓ Celebrate the 12 days of Christmas, which run from December 25 to January 5. Keep your house decorated. Continue to play Christmas music. Put 12 gifts in your kid's Christmas stockings, opening one each day.
- ✓ Attend the Epiphany festive Divine Service on January 6, hear anew the story of the wise men, and join in singing the wonderful Epiphany hymns.
- ✓ Give a surprise gift to your children on Epiphany, reminding them of the wise men's gifts to baby Jesus.

What's more, use this season to be gracious to your exhausted neighbors. Greet others warmly and genuinely with a "Merry Christmas" as you're out and about. Be patient with weary store employees. Hold open the door for others. Be generous to those who are struggling. Smile and be joyous.



Keep Jesus at the center of it all and this will indeed be the most wonderful time of the year. Week after week you will find Him wrapped up in the swaddling clothes of His holy Word and blessed Sacraments and lying in the manger of His Church... for you. And having received His gracious gifts, day after day you can praise God for the gift of His Son and make widely known His coming by spreading the Christmas joy to those around you.

The Sunday School is delighted to sing "Savior of Nations Come" on December 3 and is preparing to sing "From Heaven Above to Earth I Come".

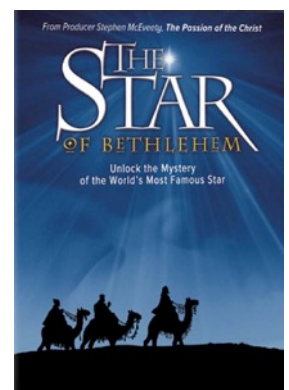

Christmas Food Drive: The Thrivent group is again sponsoring the Christmas Food Drive in connection with the Giving Tree for our members who are in need this holiday season. This year there are more names on our list than any other year so far. We have families with children, single parents, couples and seniors who can benefit from our help. Bring your contribution to church by **Sunday, December 17**. In addition to food brought by congregation members, Thrivent Financial has given us \$250 to purchase extra food items for a festive Christmas dinner: turkeys, potatoes, dessert, etc. What should you bring? We typically have special floral arrangements for certain festivals: palms on Palm Sunday, spring flowers on Easter Sunday, red bouquets on Confirmation, and poinsettias on Christmas. If you would like to contribute flowers to help beautify the sanctuary on a Lord's Day, please add your name to any open Sunday on the flower charts.

Prices are \$40, \$45, or \$50 for two bouquets, (subject to change). If you sign up, **Karen Moritz** will contact you to get your price range, flower request, and a brief note to place in the worship bulletin. When the worship service is over, you are welcome to take your bouquets home or you may leave them at church for the following Sunday or for pastor to take to homebound or hospitalized members.



Forms to order poinsettias to decorate the sanctuary for the Christmas season are in the narthex. Completed forms and money are due by **Sunday, December 17**. In lieu of purchasing a poinsettia, consider donating to purchase handcrafted chrismos for next year's tree.

Ten Ways to Share the Heart of Jesus This Christmas

“For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life.” [John 3:16]

1. Give the Gift of Encouragement. Instead of writing letters to Santa, have children write letters to someone who needs encouragement this Christmas (i.e. soldiers, nursing home residents, congregational shut-ins, or hospital patients).
2. Give the Gift of Hope. Adopt a needy family in your church or community. Bless them with Christmas gifts, a special dinner, or donate thru the Giving Tree.
3. Give the Gift of Joy. Find simple ways to bring a smile to someone’s face during the Christmas season. For example, pay for the car behind you at a drive-through, smile at everyone you see, and wish others a “Blessed Christmas.”
4. Give the Gift of Kindness. Offer your time or energy to someone in need. Hang lights for an elderly neighbor, shovel a driveway, offer to entertain young children or wrap presents for an overwhelmed parent.
5. Give the Gift of Words. Speak words of affirmation and affection to your friends and family. Take time to write a special note in your Christmas cards.
6. Give the Gift of Faith. Read the Christmas story with your family. Talk about what Christ’s birth means for your life today.
7. Give the Gift of Peace. In the midst of the hustle and bustle of the season, set aside one “silent night” to be at home. Light a fire, curl up with a cup of hot chocolate, and take a few moments to rest.
8. Give the Gift of Hospitality. Invite someone to your home who may not have family close by or host an open house for your neighbors.
9. Give the Gift of Time. Help nursing home residents write Christmas letters, spend a few hours at a shelter, or offer to babysit so busy parents can go on a date.
10. Give the Gift of Love. Whatever you do, ask God to help you reflect His heart and share the love that inspired Him to send us the very best gift of all.
