## **Cheap Imitations**

Almost anyone who has spent time in downtown Chicago has been offered a Rolex watch by some guy on a street corner at an unbelievable price. While the knockoff may look like the real thing, its quality will never compare with the original. And yet, because each of us has different tastes and budgets, sometimes cheaper imitations such as cubic zirconia jewelry, clothing from a discount store, or private label foods from a grocery store *are* preferable. The small amount my family spends on non-designer clothing (usually on clearance) would make fashion-minded people cringe. And the fact that Aldi is our favorite grocery store would invoke the same reaction from those who are culinary snobs.

But when it comes to faith, cheap imitations are nothing short of dangerous and deadly.

In June we were all bombarded with rainbow imagery in connection with a sinful lifestyle that marches under the slogan "pride" (ironically, a deadly sin!). But no matter how often the rainbow is corrupted by those who flaunt their sin, Christians know that the rainbow was, is, and always will be a beautiful reminder that God will never again flood the entire earth as He did back in Noah's day (cf. Genesis 6–9). The rainbow is God's creation. Every rainbow God sends via sunshine and raindrops is an original masterpiece by which He shows us His merciful heart. In contrast, every rainbow that flaunts sin is a cheap imitation that hardens human hearts against God.

Cheap imitations have been around ever since the devil first tempted Adam and Eve. Unlike God, the devil cannot create anything. He can only use or misuse what God has created in his attempts to corrupt God's creation. Most of this he does by imitating God. Since God is triune (Mt 28:19), so the devil works as an



unholy trinity with the beast of the sea and the beast of the earth (Rev 13). Since God is light (1 Jn 1:5), so the devil disguises himself as an angel of light (2 Cor 11:14). Since Jesus is the Lion of the tribe of Judah who conquered our greatest enemies (Rev 5:5), so the devil prowls around like a roaring lion seeking to devour us (1 Pet 5:8). Since Jesus is the Good Shepherd whose voice leads His sheep to safety, so the devil sends false shepherds with false words to lead the sheep astray.

Martin Luther once said, "Where God builds a church, there the devil builds a chapel." These words are simply a restating of one of Jesus' own parables, which begins with these words, "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field, but while his men were sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat and went away" (Mt 13:24-25). Wherever God sows good seed, there the devil sows weeds. Where God builds His Church, there the devil builds his chapel. For the devil is nothing more than an imitator who builds cheap imitations.

The devil's imitations are all around us. Religion that teaches a false god. Religion that self-justifies. Religion that obscures Christ crucified. Religion that confuses Law and Gospel. Religion that indulges the flesh. Religion that is merely moralistic, or therapeutic, or materialistic. Being spiritual but not religious. On and on this list of imitations goes.

But shining as a beacon of light in this imitation-darkened world is the sure and certain Word of God that endures forever. From Genesis to Revelation, this Word of God champions Jesus Christ and Him crucified for the life of the world. Jesus Christ is the genuine thing, the real deal, the pearl of great price, the priceless treasure. He came to save sinners. To save you. To save me. He came to grant us forgiveness, life, and salvation — the real things, not some cheap imitations.

Friends, the world around us is buying up the devil's cheap imitations at record pace. Each of us has loved ones, friends, and neighbors who put their faith in this "self-made religion" (Col 2:23). Let us pray for them. Let us speak the truth in love to them. Let us continue to love and serve them in whatever vocations God has placed us. And let us fill our ears with God's Word regularly that we might guard ourselves against the influence of these cheap imitations.

To that end, heed the words of Saint Paul: "But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work" (2 Tim 3:14-17).

## **Six Youth to Attend Conference**



- families buy the certificates at full face value and redeem them for full face value;
- your organization gets the difference as revenue.

Presto Pay and reloading cards are also available. Printable forms are also available on the website (shopwithscrip.com).

Why Scrip is better for families:

- 1. There are over 700 brands to choose from, so they can use scrip on practically every purchase.
- 2. Scrip is a great budgeting tool since families can use scrip for gas, groceries, and other household expenses.
- 3. Families can shop in-store or online at participating retailers.
- 4. They could place their own orders online, which will maximize their earnings.
- 5. Paying with gift cards keeps families safe from credit card fraud.
