## A Much-Needed Renovation

Last month the renovation of our church kitchen began. The first two days were perhaps the most fun. After all of our supplies were removed, the destruction began. And it went quickly. Cabinet doors. Drawers. Countertops. Then the cabinets themselves. Cut into pieces. Completely removed. Trashed.

Now the really hard work begins. For constructing is necessarily more time-consuming, more detailed, more deliberate than destroying. There are walls to patch and paint. Measurements to take and double check. A floor to lay. Electric, gas, and plumbing to move or adapt. New cabinets and countertops to install. And then the finishing touches. When everything is done, our renovated kitchen will be very functional and beautiful and will serve us well for decades to come.



But kitchens aren't the only things that need renovation.

People do too. And I'm not just talking about the surface stuff, for which there are countless self-help books at the library and shows on television. Sinners need daily renovation. Daily renewal. Daily reformation. Thankfully, we have a God who loves to renovate. And He does it by re-creating us.

Merriam-Webster defines the word *renovate* as follows:

verb | ren·o·vate | \ 're-nə-, vāt \

: to restore to a former better state (as by cleaning, repairing, or rebuilding)

The only "former better state" we've had is the perfection of our first parents before the fall into sin. Unfortunately, there's no amount of cleaning or repairing or rebuilding that can restore that state. So God sent forth His only-begotten Son as the second Adam, to die in our place, to rise from the dead, and to grant us newness of life in Him. To accomplish that in our individual lives, God first destroys by means of the Law. Then He re-creates by means of the Gospel.

Holy Scripture reveals to us the God who wounds and heals, the God who kills and makes alive, the God who brings down to the grave and then raises up to newness of life. Here is a sampling:

- "See now that I, even I, am He, and there is no god beside Me; I kill and I make alive; I wound and I heal; and there is none that can deliver out of My hand" (Deut 32:39).
- "The LORD kills and brings to life; He brings down to Sheol and raises up" (1 Sam 2:6).
- "He wounds, but He binds up; He shatters, but His hands heal" (Job 5:18).
- "Come, let us return to the LORD; for He has torn us, that He may heal us; He has struck us down, and He will bind us up" (Hos 6:1).

Notice the order of things. First He wounds, then He heals. First He kills, then He makes alive. First He brings down to the grave, then He raises up from the grave. That is God's Law and Gospel at work. The Law puts to death our Old Adam and kills our self-righteousness. The Gospel freely grants us newness of life and gives us the righteousness of Christ.

When most people think of God and His work, they think only of the Gospel. Only of His grace and mercy and forgiveness. That is the main thing, but not the only thing. For before the Gospel can do its work, first the Law must do its work. This wounding, this killing, this bringing down to the grave is what Martin Luther referred to as God’s alien work. Luther got this phrase from the prophet Isaiah: “The LORD will rise up ... to do His deed—strange is His deed! and to work His work—alien is His work!” (Is 28:21).

So rejoice when God does His alien work in you. When He calls you to repentance. When He chastises and disciplines you. For that is the only way for true renovation to take place. The Old Adam in you must die (and it must die daily), so that the New Man (Christ in you) can emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity. Saint Paul says it this way: “Put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and ... put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness” (Eph 4:22-24). It’s why we pray King David’s prayer: “Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me” (Ps 51:10).

Church kitchens take time to construct properly. So does Christian piety. Thankfully, God is a patient builder — putting everything in its proper place at the proper time. He is also a patient farmer — planting, watering, cultivating, weeding. He is also a patient potter — slowing shaping and molding you into a vessel to fulfill His purposes.

Friends, you are a work in progress. So am I. It began in Holy Baptism and it will end only when our Lord Jesus leads us through the valley of the shadow of death to Himself in heaven. In the meantime, remember that renovation is hard and painful work. But such is God’s will as He wounds and then heals you. As He kills your sinful flesh and then enlivens your faith in Jesus Christ. You don’t see the finished product yet, for your eyes can only see what the Law reveals: a flawed sinner with thoughts, desires, words, and deeds that fall short of God’s will. But faith clings to what God’s Word declares: that you are perfectly holy and righteous in Jesus Christ.

For now, believe what God says about you. For He sees you through the cross of His Son, through the blood of His Son, through the perfect atonement of His Son. Thus, He sees you as a baptized, beloved child with whom He is well pleased. “Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come” (2 Cor 5:17).

We invite all children in the congregation, preschool, and community to join us for Vacation Bible School **July 16-18** (Monday–Wednesday).

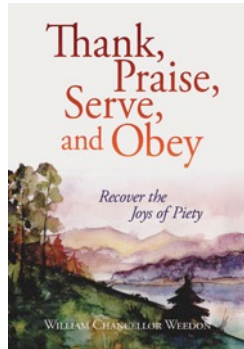

Our “book of the month” for July is *Thank, Praise, Serve, and Obey: Recover the Joys of Piety* by William Weedon.

Pietism is inwardly focused, obsessed with carefully following spiritual to-do lists and rules. Piety fights against that inward focus, turning our attention out toward God and His promises and toward our neighbor in love and care. Piety is simply the cultivation of godly habits—habits that befit the household of God, the family of our heavenly Father. In *Thank, Praise, Serve, and Obey*, we explore how to properly hear in the Scriptures our heavenly Father summoning us to the joy and freedom of living and growing as His beloved children through Jesus Christ.

### Principles in Giving

**“The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.”**

*2 Corinthians 9:6-7*

Here we find the answer to the question, “How should I give?” The answer? Cheerfully!

You see, God is not primarily concerned with the amount of the gift, but with the motive that lies behind it. All the money in the world belongs to God.
