<u>A WELCOME IN JESUS' NAME</u> to all who gather in the Lord's House today. You have joined with the seen and unseen host of God, around the throne of the Lamb, to be served by the Triune God through the preaching of His Word and the administration of the Holy Sacraments. Apart from these Means of Grace there are no Christians and there is no Church! Therefore the entire Liturgy places God at center stage as He acts towards His people through the Word and Sacraments to bring His gifts of life and salvation. That is why the Liturgy is called "Divine Service" - <u>it is God's Service to His people</u>! This service reaches its fulfillment in the Lord's Supper or Sacrament of the Altar.

When he preaches repentance, John the Baptist points us to Christ Jesus. John was sent by God "as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him" (John 1:7). He baptizes with water in order to "make straight the way of the Lord," who shall redeem His people from their sins (John 1:23). That Lord Jesus "who comes after" John now stands among us and makes Himself known to us (John 1:26–27). He has been anointed by the Holy Spirit "to bring good news to the poor" and "to bind up the brokenhearted" (Is. 61:1). By the washing of the water with His Word and Spirit, He clothes His Church with "the garments of salvation" and adorns her with His own righteousness "as a bride adorns herself with her jewels" (Is. 61:10). Therefore, we "rejoice always" in the Lord, "pray without ceasing" and "give thanks in all circumstances" (1 Thess. 5:16–18). For "the God of peace," who has called you by the Gospel, will surely "sanctify you completely," so that "your whole spirit and soul and body" will "be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Thess. 5:23–24).






Epistle

¹⁹ And this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" ²⁰ He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ." ²¹ And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No." ²² So

they said to him, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" ²³ He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said." ²⁴ (Now they had been sent from the Pharisees.) ²⁵ They asked him, "Then why are you baptizing, if you are neither the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" ²⁶ John answered them, "I baptize with water, but among you stands one you do not know, ²⁷ even he who comes after me, the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy to untie." ²⁸ These things took place in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

Such laudable ceremonies include making the sign of the cross in remembrance of Holy Baptism. Those places in the service where Lutherans have traditionally made the sign of the cross are marked with a cross (\mathfrak{A}).


"There was a man sent by God, whose name was John" [John 1:6].



Mark and Luke also begin their gospels with John the Baptist, and it is fitting to begin with him, as Christ himself says in Matthew 11[:12]: "Since the days of John the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence." And in Acts 1[:22] St. Peter says that Christ began after John's baptism, in which he was also ordained and called to be a teacher, as John the Baptist shows when he says in John

1:[32–34, cf. Matt. 3:16]: "I saw the Holy Spirit descend like a dove and I heard the voice of the Father, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.' " Then Christ was made a teacher, and his ministry began. Then the gospel had its beginning through Christ himself; for no one except Christ himself was to begin the exalted, blessed, comforting mission of the word. Because of this John had to come first and prepare the people for the preaching so that they might receive the light and the life. For, as we have heard, Christ is everywhere the light which shines in the darkness and is not comprehended; he was particularly present among the Israelites in his human nature and through his human nature he physically appeared among them and yet he was not recognized. For this reason only did his forerunner John come to this place, preaching concerning him, in order that he should be known and received. Therefore this passage follows the previous one nicely and fittingly: for when Christ, the shining light, was not recognized, John came forward, opened men's eyes and pointed out the shining light which was present.
