

CHRISTMAS DAY

Welcome! Two Christmases vie for our allegiance and attention: the Christmas of our society and the Christmas of the Church. For our society, Christmas is a time of nostalgia for the innocence of childhood and of yearning for a golden age. Underlying the cultural

Christmas is an element of truth, but only imperfectly remembered and understood. The Christmas of faith also remembers a time of innocence: Eden and a world created in beauty and harmony.

The Church celebrates the mystery of salvation revealed in Christ's birth, more so than the birthday itself. Today we celebrate the mystery of God becoming man in Jesus who is both our King and our Savior.

THIS MORNING WE CELEBRATE THE LORD'S SUPPER. Today, our Lord, whose birth we celebrate, invites us to be guests at the Altar to celebrate the Lord's Supper. Here we receive the gift of forgiveness He purchased and won through His perfect life and His innocent suffering and death.

COMMUNION Luther once said, "Word and Sacrament are the manger and swaddling clothes into which it has pleased Christ to lay Himself". Just as the shepherds were told where to find Jesus then, so also we are told where to find Him still today. He is no longer in the humble manger; but by His own promise, He is in the humble means of bread and wine with His true body and blood. As we receive His gift, the greatest gift we can give to others is a loving witness to the truth of His Word. For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of "Closed Communion." If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Divine Shepherd, or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Zimmer about

Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation. It is the sincere prayer of this congregation that our careful practice of the administration of the Lord's Supper will not be a hindrance to our fellowship with you but instead that it would lead you to appreciate the high regard we have for Christ and His Word concerning this precious gift. **God bless you for your understanding!**


After the Bell is rung, the congregation rises and turns toward the Narthex. The attention of the congregation is directed to the Processional Cross.














- "These are the signs that you shall mark: 5 The swaddling clothes and manger dark. There you will find the infant laid By whom the heav'ns and earth were made."
