

<u>A WELCOME IN JESUS' NAME WELCOME TO OUR CONGREGATION.</u> Today the Church Year marks the festival of the "Transfiguration of our Lord." The Transfiguration is the culmination of the Epiphany season and stands at the threshold of the season of Lent which begins this week with the Ash Wednesday service.

As we look back to the Epiphany Season now ending, we see the many events that have marked the life of Jesus whereby He has revealed that He is true God - His Baptism with the anointing by the Holy Spirit and the voice from heaven of the Father, His miracles, and His teaching. Throughout Epiphany the Gospel accounts have pointed us to the divinity of

Christ and to the glory His human nature possessed. As we look forward, we behold the season of Lent.

During Lent we are witnesses as Jesus purposefully moves toward the Mount of Calvary where He suffers and dies for the sins of the whole world. But before we leave this season there is one more event in the life of Jesus we will observe - the event on the Mountain of Transfiguration.

Today we gather to receive from God a glimpse of the glory which He gave to His Son, and which His Son shares with the Church through Word and Sacrament. That glory was manifested in the light that shone at Bethlehem and as the light that shone on the Mountain of Transfiguration.

But the death of the transfigured Christ is God's greatest glory. Nowhere does God's glory shine more brightly than as the light that pierces the darkness of Calvary, where Christ gives himself for us as the sacrifice for our sins. Again, today He gives us His body and blood to eat and to drink that we might share in that glory.

It was "a hard thing" that Elisha asked, but by his persistence he was able to see the prophet Elijah being taken "by a whirlwind into heaven." Although "chariots of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them," Elisha received Elijah's cloak and a "double portion" of his spirit for preaching the Lord's Word (2 Kings 2:9–11). It was a hard thing, too, for Israel to see Moses and come near to him, when "the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God" (Ex. 34:29–30). Therefore, after "he commanded them all that the Lord had spoken with him in Mount Sinai," Moses "put a veil over his face" (Ex. 34:32–33). Only the Word of the Gospel lifts the veil, and "only through Christ is it taken away" (2 Cor. 3:14). Thus are we able to behold "the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ," who is "the image of God" (2 Cor. 4:4–6). For the Law and the prophets are all fulfilled in Him. Therefore, "listen to him," and fix your sights on "Jesus only" (Mark 9:7–8).

The 99th is a psalm of instruction that exhorts the people of Israel to praise their God in Zion – despite the fact that the nations rage against them because they are a special people of God before all others. They suffer much on that account. The psalmist praises Moses, Aaron, and Samuel, who were chief among the people of Israel. However, (as the words declare) he also teaches the people of Israel themselves that they should know that true worship consists not in the sacrifice of many cattle, but rather in knowing God's wonders and giving Him thanks for making them godly and redeeming them from sin.

So the two of them went on. ⁷ Fifty men of the sons of the prophets also went and stood at some distance from them, as they both were standing by the Jordan. ⁸ Then Elijah took his cloak and rolled it up and struck the water, and the water was parted to the one side and to the other, till the two of them could go over on dry ground. ⁹ When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Ask what I shall do for you, before I am taken from you." And Elisha said, "Please let there be a double portion of your spirit on me." ¹⁰ And he said, "You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it shall be so for you, but if you do not see me, it shall not be so." ¹¹ And as they still went on and talked, behold, chariots of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them. And Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven. ¹² And Elisha saw it and he cried, "My father, my father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!" And he saw him no more. Then he took hold of his own clothes and tore them in two pieces.

Since we have such a hope, we are very bold, ¹³ not like Moses, who would put a veil over his face so that the Israelites might not gaze at the outcome of what was being brought to an end.



The Lutheran Church retains ceremonies that underscore and support the Gospel—the good news that we are saved by *grace alone* through *faith alone* in *Christ alone*. Such laudable ceremonies include making the sign of the cross in remembrance of Holy Baptism. Those places in the service where Lutherans have traditionally made the sign of the cross are marked with a cross ($\mathbf{*}$).



Christ himself warned most gravely against changing his words when, for instance, he says in Matthew 5 [:19], "Whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches men so, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven." Our Father in heaven himself has testified in a glorious voice, "This is my beloved son; listen to him" [Mark 9:7]. And in Psalm 2 [:11–12], "Cherish the Lord lest he be angry." And in John 13 we read, "He who rejects me rejects him who sent me." "My teaching is not mine but his who sent me" [John 7:16], etc. O God in heaven, even though we accept Christ's word in all fear and honor, we are still far from acting in accordance with it, as St. Peter says, "The righteous man is scarcely saved" [1 Pet. 4:18]. What then is to become of those who despise his word and alter it to suit themselves? Worst of all, what is to become of those who murder and persecute others just for not despising both Christ and his word? It is hideous and awful to contemplate.

Thus the service and worship of the Gospel is to receive good things from God, while the worship of the law is to offer and present our goods to God. We cannot offer anything to God unless we have first been reconciled and reborn. The greatest possible comfort comes from this doctrine that the highest worship in the Gospel is the desire to receive forgiveness of sins, grace, and righteousness. About this worship Christ speaks in John 6:40, "This is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him should have eternal life." And the Father says (Matt. 17:5; Mark 9:7), "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."
