<u>A WELCOME IN JESUS' NAME</u> to all who gather in the Lord's House today. You have joined with the seen and unseen host of God, around the throne of the Lamb, to be served by the Triune God through the preaching of His Word and the administration of the Holy Sacraments. Apart from these Means of Grace there are no Christians and there is no Church! Therefore the entire Liturgy places God at center stage as He acts towards His people through the Word and Sacraments to bring His gifts of life and salvation. That is why the Liturgy is called "Divine Service" - <u>it is God's Service to His people</u>! This service reaches its fulfillment in the Lord's Supper or Sacrament of the Altar.

The Lord Jesus is "the good shepherd" who "lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:11). His life is not taken from Him, but He lays it down willingly, of His own accord, because He knows and loves the sheep. As the One sent by the Father, He has the "authority to lay it down" and the "authority to take it up again" (John 10:18). So has He done, and now He continues to love and serve as the Good Shepherd of the sheep by the voice of His Gospel. He thus calls all people into the fold of His Church, so that there may be "one flock, one shepherd" (John 10:16). That is why the apostles "were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead" (Acts 4:2). Since "there is salvation in no one else," His voice rings out to this day through the preaching of His name, "for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12). His voice comforts our hearts against all condemnation and gives us courage to "love one another" and "to lay down our lives for the brothers," as He laid down His life for us (1 John 3:16, 23).

Prayer before Worship



INTROIT

PSALM 23; ANTIPHON: JOHN 10:14, 15B

The 23rd Psalm is a psalm of thanks in which a Christian heart praises and thanks God for teaching him and keeping him on the right way, comforting and protecting him in every danger through His Holy Word. The psalmist compares himself to a sheep that a faithful shepherd leads into fresh grass and cool water. In addition, he shows the table, the cup, and oil also as images from the Old Testament worship and call it all God's Word, as it is also called rod and staff, grass, water, and the way of righteousness. This Psalm belongs in the Third Commandment and in the Second Petition.


As we celebrate this Sacrament, we also humbly acknowledge the Bible's concern for doctrinal oneness by those who receive it together.



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SOLI DEO GLORIA #

The Lutheran Church retains ceremonies that underscore and support the Gospel—the good news that we are saved by *grace alone* through *faith alone* in *Christ alone*. Such laudable ceremonies include making the sign of the cross in remembrance of Holy Baptism. Those places in the service where Lutherans have traditionally made the sign of the cross are marked with a cross (\mathfrak{A}).

Through the Word of God there is to come out of such a variety of worship, one harmonious flock under one Shepherd (John 10:16). It is truly wonderful that a human heart can dare conceive of this, believe in it, and firmly prophesy that it will happen, especially when one considers how hard the devil will oppose, resist, and block it with all the power and wisdom of this world, so that it would seem to be a sheer impossibility. Nevertheless, the psalmist has the courage to say it, and in spite of all it has come to pass. Both are great miracles: that a man should believe this, and that it should actually happen.

From this we see that the Word of God must be an almighty power of God (Rom. 1:16). It has cleaned up the idolatry, sectarianism, and error that then prevailed in the world so thoroughly that not a shred remains, despite the fact that emperors, princes, wise men, saints, all devils, and the whole world raged with such stubborn violence against it. The world has never taken it upon itself to fight idolatry. It can put up with any amount of error. But when God's Word comes, the world goes mad and refuses to stand for it. The world has had to stand for it, however, and has even been thoroughly defeated. This is the greatest work God has done on earth, much greater than leading the Children of Israel out of Egypt, when only King Pharaoh and his followers were drowned in the Red Sea. But now the whole angry, perverse world has been drowned, and God's Word and Christendom survive. Let us praise such a work, and let us comfort ourselves with the conviction given us by this example, that God's Word will and must remain even though the devil and the world storm and rage against it ever so violently. The Word has done many wonders in the world, and it is not finished yet.
