THE DIVINE SERVICE OF HOLY COMMUNION

HE IS RISEN! He is risen indeed! Christ is victorious and so are we! Don't you know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may walk in newness of life. Romans 6:3-4

A WELCOME IN JESUS' NAME to all who gather in the Lord's House today. You have joined with the seen and unseen host of God to be served by the Triune God through the preaching of His Word and the administration of the Holy Sacraments. Apart from these Means of Grace there are no Christians and there is no Church! Therefore the entire Liturgy places God at center stage as He acts towards His people through these Means to bring His gifts of life and salvation. That is why the Liturgy is called "Divine Service" - <u>it is God's Service to His people</u>! This service reaches its fulfillment in the Lord's Supper or Sacrament of the Altar.

DEAR GUESTS, The Easter message "He Is Risen" would mean nothing to us unless our gracious God had provided the means by which we each may receive the blessings earned for us by Christ's death and guaranteed by His resurrection. The ways God brings the forgiveness Jesus earned for us on the cross is through the Holy Scriptures, Absolution, Baptism and the Lord's Supper! As we celebrate this Sacrament, we also humbly acknowledge the Bible's concern for doctrinal oneness by those who receive it together. For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of "Closed Communion." If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Divine Shepherd, or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod we respectfully ask that you not commune this morning. Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Zimmer about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation. It is the sincere prayer of this congregation that our careful practice of the administration of the Lord's Supper will not be a hindrance to our fellowship with you but instead that it would lead you to appreciate the high regard we have for Christ and His Word concerning this precious gift. Thank you for your understanding.



The Resurrection






Service of the Sacrament

How Do We Prepare For Death?

In the past much has been written, and with a show of great learning at that, about the manner in which we should prepare for death and await the last day. But it has only made timid consciences much more depressed, for the writers have not been able to refer men to the consolation of the great wealth of grace and salvation in Christ but have merely directed people to their own works and pious lives as a support against death and the judgment of God.

Instead of such misdirection we now see the precious grace of God at work. Whoever has the Word of the Gospel goes forth to discharge the duties of whatever office or position he may hold. He consoles himself with the fact that through Baptism he is incorporated in Christ. He receives absolution and for the strengthening of his faith partakes of the Lord's Supper, committing his soul to Christ. Why should such a person fear death? Regardless of when it comes, whether by pestilence or accident, whether it finds him awake or asleep, he is in Christ and is, therefore, always ready and well prepared for death.
