

Setting 1



CHRIST HAS ASCENDED AND IS SEATED AT THE RIGHT HAND OF THE THRONE OF

GOD. But the Ascension does not mean that He has left His beloved bride for He promises to remain with His Church to lead, guide, comfort and sustain Her. One of the ways in which our Lord fulfills this promise is in the Sacrament of the Altar. It is Jesus, present with His body and blood, who invites you to be His guest at the Altar and to receive from Him His very body broken and His blood shed for the forgiveness of sin. Here He gives His Bride Her life. Here He gives His bride Her hope of salvation. Here He gives His Bride the righteousness and purity that She must have to dwell with Her Savior for eternity.

After He rose from the dead, the Lord Jesus presented Himself alive to the apostles, "appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God" (Acts 1:3). When He ascended to the right hand of the Father, He did not orphan His Church, but He fills all things in heaven and on earth and gives gifts to His disciples. Even now, through His Church, He continues "to do and teach" (Acts 1:1), preaching "repentance for the forgiveness of sins" (Luke 24:47), even "to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8). Though the cloud hid Jesus from the sight of His disciples then, and He remains hidden from sight even now, He remains with His people through His Gospel and Sacraments. He comes to us by the word of His apostles, by the promise of His Father and by the power of the Holy Spirit, whom He pours out upon "the church," which is his body" (Eph. 1:22-23). In this Holy Christian Church, we bless God and worship Christ with joy, for in His Church He blesses us with forgiveness, lifts us up in His hands and seats us with Himself "in the heavenly places" (Eph. 1:20).

CONFESSION OF SINS 1 John 1:8-9

The 110th psalm is a prophecy of Christ, that He shall be an eternal king and priest, indeed true God, sitting at the right hand of God the Father, and that He would be glorified and recognized. In the entire Scripture there is nothing like this psalm. It would be right to acknowledge it as the chief confirmation of the Christian faith. For nowhere else is Christ prophesied with such clear, plain words as a priest and an eternal priest. It is prophesied as well that the priesthood of Aaron would be abolished. This psalm is yet again and more splendidly extolled in the Epistle to the Hebrews. It is indeed a shame that such a psalm is not more richly extolled by Christians.

Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, ²until the day when he was taken up, after he had given commands through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. ³To them he presented himself alive after his suffering by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God.

The Paschal Candle

At the conclusion of the Gospel reading the Paschal Candle, which has been lit since Easter, will be extinguished. The Paschal Candle symbolizes the visible presence of Christ with His disciples after His resurrection. With His ascension Jesus' visible presence is withdrawn, yet He continues to abide with His Church through the preaching of His Word and the administration of the Sacraments. The Paschal Candle will again be lit at Easter next year and will also be lit during Funerals and at Baptisms, as a confession of Christ's Resurrection.





Dear Visitors and Friends: The right hand of God is not a confining physical spot! It is, rather, the almighty power of God which fills heaven and earth. THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD to God's right hand, therefore, means that He now fills and rules all things with His power and majesty, not only as God but also as man. For Him it is not too great a thing to be present with His very body and blood of the Lord's Supper as he promised. As we receive this Sacrament, the oneness of fellowship at the Altar (I Corinthians 10:17) presupposes a oneness in doctrine with the Apostles (Acts 2:42). For this reason the congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have agreed to follow the Biblical and historical practice of "Closed Communion." If you desire to receive the Lord's Supper and are not a communicant member of Divine Shepherd or a sister congregation in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod we respectfully ask that you **not commune this evening.** Rather, we would invite you to speak with Pastor Zimmer about Holy Communion and about becoming a communicant member of this congregation. It is the sincere prayer of this congregation that our careful practice of the administration of the Lord's Supper will not be a hindrance to our fellowship with you but instead that it would lead you to appreciate the high regard we have for Christ and His Word concerning this precious gift. 



The Lutheran Church retains ceremonies that underscore and support the Gospel—the good news that we are saved by *grace alone* through *faith alone* in *Christ alone*. Such laudable ceremonies include making the sign of the cross in remembrance of Holy Baptism. Those places in the service where Lutherans have traditionally made the sign of the cross are marked with a cross (*).

Ascension Day commemorates the ascension of Christ into Heaven. Also known as the Feast of Ascension, it occurs on the Thursday 40 days after Easter. According to Augustine of Hippo, one of the early church fathers, the Feast of Ascension originated with the Apostles. John Chrysostom and Gregory of Nyssa, contemporaries of Augustine, refer to it as being one of the oldest feasts practiced by the Church, possibly going as far back as AD 68. There is no written evidence, however, of the Church honoring Ascension Day until Augustine's time in the fourth century. For many Christians, Ascension Day's meaning provides a sense of hope that the glorious and triumphant return of Christ is near. It is a reminder of the Kingdom of God within their hearts, and of the ever-present Spirit of God, watching over and protecting them as they spread the light of Jesus' truth throughout the world.
