

<u>A WELCOME IN JESUS' NAME</u> to all who gather in the Lord's House today. You have joined with the seen and unseen host of God, around the throne of the Lamb, to be served by the Triune God through the preaching of His Word and the administration of the Holy Sacraments. Apart from these Means of Grace there are no Christians and there is no Church! Therefore, the entire Liturgy places God at center stage as He acts towards His people through the Word and Sacraments to bring His gifts of life and salvation. That is why the Liturgy is called "Divine Service" - <u>it is God's Service to His people</u>! This service reaches its fulfillment in the Lord's Supper or Sacrament of the Altar.

The crucified and risen Lord Jesus is with His Church through the word of His apostles, who "are witnesses of all that he did." He was anointed by God "with the Holy Spirit and with power," and "he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil," and so He was with those whom He sent "to preach to the people" (Acts 10:38–42). The Holy Spirit is bestowed on those who hear that apostolic preaching, who are "baptized in the name of Jesus Christ," so that "everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name" (Acts 10:43–44, 48). For as He came by the water of His Baptism, even to the blood of His Passion, so the Spirit testifies to the truth with "the water and the blood" in the apostolic ministry of the Gospel (1 John 5:6–7). By these means, Christ Jesus speaks to us, that His joy may be in us and that our "joy may be full." For this purpose, He appointed the apostles to "go and bear fruit" in order to make known His divine friendship to us (John 15:11, 15–16).

Prayer before Worship



CONFESSION OF SINS

1 John 1:8-9

The First Reading

Acts 10:34–48

Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), ³⁷you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. 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



Acknowledgments

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The Lutheran Church retains ceremonies that underscore and support the Gospel—the good news that we are saved by *grace alone* through *faith alone* in *Christ alone*. Such laudable ceremonies include making the sign of the cross in remembrance of Holy Baptism. Those places in the service where Lutherans have traditionally made the sign of the cross are marked with a cross (\mathfrak{A}).

Is This Proposition True: "Good Works are Necessary"?

It is true both with regard to sense and with regard to the form of sound words. For in the Augsburg **Confession** and the Apology these propositions are common and accepted: that good works are necessary; that it is necessary to do good works; that good works should necessarily follow reconciliation: that we necessarily ought to do divinely commanded good works. And the position of Scripture is, that good works are to be done because they are necessary on the basis of the command of God, and we are debtors. For the will and command of God is that believers should not be idle (Mt 3:10; 7:19; 20:6), but that they walk and exercise themselves in good works (1 Th 4:3; Jn 15:12; 1 Jn 4:21). Hence Scripture also uses this terminology, that the new obedience of the reborn is not arbitrary, but necessary and required. Ro 8:12; 13:5, 8; 15:1; 1 Co 9:16; Lk 17:10; 1 Jn 4:11.
