Dear Disciples of Christ with an awesome responsibility.

Last Sunday after the divine service you heard "February 9th" mentioned. It is the day on which the board of Elders, the "call" committee of Divine Shepherd, plans to have you extend a divine call. The next day I read in the Landmark, a local newspaper, that St. Louise Catholic school of LaGrange Park was on the 'chopping" block of the archdiocese of Chicago. It was soon to be closed. Many Lutheran schools in neighboring villages have also been closed in recent years for the same reason, low enrollment, but they were never on the "chopping" block of the Education Executive of the Northern Illinois District of our Synod. What does this have to do with "February 9th"? Here is where my addressing you in this letter with, "Dear Disciples of Christ with an awesome responsibility" is significant.

The words of Jesus to St. Peter in St. Matthew 16:19, "I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven" are behind the closing of St. Louise school by the archdiocese of Chicago. For Roman Catholics these words of Jesus to St. Peter establish the successor of St. Peter, the pope, as the one who governs the universal church. The governance is transmitted through the sacrament of ordination. Therefore, it is the archdiocese, that has the keys, the keys that can open or close the doors of St. Louise.

As one studies the history of the Missouri Synod our Synod almost adopted the same policy, not that we would have a pope, but in 1839 on board one of the ships brought them to this country some of our founders said that they needed a 'free episcopal (bishop) form of polity". They approached Pastor Stephan, the leader of the Saxon immigrants who established our Synod with the words, "Accept, Reverend Father, also for the future, the office of bishop among us, bestowed upon you by God, and grant that we may now express with this name our unqualified confidence in your fatherly love and pastoral faithfulness toward us, and the assurance of our sincere, complete, and childlike obedience toward you". Stephan therewith became both spiritual and temporal leader. When his life revealed that he did not deserve the title of responsibility the Saxons sent him across the Mississippi to Illinois. They no longer had a bishop. The question before the Saxons now, without the "bishop," that is without the keys, which they had given to Stepan as bishop, was not just the door to the church or school closed but also the door to heaven. There were those that said to again hear and receive the key to heaven, that is the words of absolution and the supper, they had to go back to Germany. They had no bishop.

Enter Pastor Walther. To be sure, he would say to his troubled Saxon community, Jesus did say to Peter, "I will give you the keys," but he also said to the entire church, that is to the congregation, that is to Divine Shepherd Lutheran Church, in St. Matthew 18:18, "Whatever ye, (and here the old English "ye" is better than "you" for it is plural,) shall loose (forgive) on earth shall be loosed in heaven". Walther would assert that here Jesus gives the keys, not just to the clergy, (bishop or archdiocese) but to the church, the congregation. It is as it (you) possess these keys, that you the disciples with awesome responsibility will gather on February 9th. On that day the God Who has gathered you together with His means of grace, that is with the keys of the kingdom, will use you to call a man to serve you with the keys of heaven. Approach that day with prayer and thoughtfulness
