Dear Fellow, Redeemed by the Divine Shepherd,

While Ash Wednesday that begins the season of Lent has probably already been observed as you read this letter it is the holy season of Lent that is the focus of my words to you.

Historically the 40 days of Lent, in which many churches conduct Lenten services on Wednesday evenings, have offered more opportunities to be in the divine service in which God serves His People. It will be so again for us at Divine Shepherd as we gather for worship on Wednesday evenings.

In the six Lenten services to be held here we will hear the entire account of the passion of our Lord as it is given to us by the four Gospel writers. We will there see the places of the passion and hear the Words of our Lord at those places. It is my prayer that in seeing and hearing Him in those places that you will know more fully the joy for you to be in Christ and even more for Christ in you.

We will see Christ in the Upper Room and hear Him as He says, "This is my body, this cup is the new testament in my blood."

We will cross the Kedron with Him and enter Gethsemane where we will hear Him pray, "Watch and pray with me." There we will see Him captured and led away to the palace of the high priest. There we will hear Him respond to the question, "Art thou the Christ, the Son of the blessed" with the words, "I am." From there He is taken to the court of Governor Pilate, where, after He has just said, "Everyone that is of the truth, heareth my voice," Pilate asks the ultimate question, "What is truth?" We travel the Via Dolerosa with Him to Calvary where we hear Him first pray, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do."

He is silent at the final place of our Lenten journey, a new tomb, hewn out of rock in which there was an opening in front of which there was a great stone. Before they placed His wrapped body in that tomb, we will hear Him say, "Father, into Thy hands I commend my spirit."

I invite all of you on the Wednesdays of Lent to come with us to these places of the passion and there hear the words of Him Who here at this place and though His words makes you one with our Creator. There is no greater blessing.
