Why make the Sign of the Cross?



Why make the sign of the cross, isn't that Roman Catholic?" A very common statement indeed! Actually, making the sign of the cross is one of the oldest traditions in Christianity. We know that is was already a common ceremony used daily in A.D. 200, for Tertullian writes: "In all undertakings — when we enter a place or leave it; before we dress; before we bathe; when we take our meals; when we light the lamps in the evening; before we retire at night; when we sit down to read; before each task — we trace the sign of the cross on our foreheads." St. Augustine (A.D. 431) speaks of this custom many times in his sermons and letters.

It is one of the traditional ceremonies that was most definitely retained by Luther and the Lutheran Church in the 16th century Reformation. Luther prescribed it in his Small Catechism

under the heading: "How the Head of the Family Should Teach His Household to Bless Themselves in the Morning and in the Evening." He says, "In the morning when you rise (In the evening when you go to bed) you shall bless yourself with the sign of the holy cross and say: In the name of God the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. Amen." Again, in his Large Catechism he recommends that parents should instruct their children to cross themselves for the purpose of recalling their divine Protector in moments of danger, terror, and temptation.

The basic meaning of the sign of the cross is derived from Holy Baptism (hence Luther's connection with the Triune invocation of God's name). In the Baptism Liturgy the pastor makes the sign of the cross "both upon the forehead and upon the heart" to mark the candidate for Baptism as "one redeemed by Christ the crucified." Hence the sign of the cross is a way of remembering one's Baptism into Christ the crucified and the blessings that come through Him (Romans 6). That is its most basic meaning and that is how Lutherans interpret it in an evangelical (Gospel) way. Since it is neither commanded nor forbidden, Christians may or may not use it in freedom. However, it is not something to be condemned. The sign of the cross is a way of declaring your salvation. Jesus has made his cross to be yours, so that you do not have to suffer for your sin. It is right that we should make the sign of the cross frequently and to glory in it, saying with St. Paul, 'God forbid that I should glory save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ' (Gal. 6:14)."

The Sign of the Cross is the center of our confession and marking us as one redeemed by Christ. It is at the cross where God revealed Himself to us through His Son, so we make the sign of the cross while naming God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Secondly, we make the sign of the cross on our body. Christianity is a flesh and blood "religion", not merely a spiritual one but a very physical one. The main job of the Holy Spirit is to bring Christ to us in His flesh and blood through His Word and Sacrament. The sign of the cross is made upon our body knowing and confessing that God has redeemed not only our soul but also our flesh, that is, our bodies as we confess, "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead (body) and the life of the world to come." What was once Christ's now has become our own in Baptism. So we sign ourselves as one marked as redeemed in death but in death we see life.

In conclusion, being a Christian does not mean that you have to make the sign of the cross, on the other hand, we should not treat such practices as if it was merely an old Roman Catholic tradition or something of no real importance. It is a very central confession and substance of our faith in the true God who has come to us through His Son for our life and salvation.
